Attendance Matters

Education in NSW is compulsory for all students from the age of 6. Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

Having students arrive on-time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Gives students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is officially recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by a parent/carer.

It is important to remember that 5 minutes late each day is 3 days of education missed per year. This can have serious impact on your child's ability to learn and make friends.

On occasion, your child might be away from school. The NSW Government justified reasons for student absences may include:

- Being sick, or having an infectious disease
- Having an unavoidable medical appointment
- Being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- Exceptional or urgent family circumstances (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school, parents are asked to give written explanation via School Stream (school information – absentee form 2024) or email your child's teacher.


