2019 Classing

At the end of every year, teachers put <u>many</u> hours into forming classes for the next year. Teachers take into account how children work, who children work best with and friendship factors. As a school community we need to remember that children are in class for the best possible education, and classroom teachers have a deep understanding of class dynamics and how the students in their classes work best.

If you are concerned that your child has significant special needs that the classroom teacher is unaware of, or there are extenuating circumstances that need to be taken into account in 2019 classing you can make an appointment to meet with me to explain your child's need. If this is the case, can you please contact the office to make an appointment between 5 November and 16 November.

Attention Year 5 Parents – Application for Selective High School for 2020.

Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, using specialised teaching methods and materials at the appropriate level.

Hearing in Kindy

Last week, KA were able to learn all about their ears. Each week Mowbray is visited by two Specialist Hearing Itinerant Teachers, Mrs Platt and Mrs Graham, who assist students who have a hearing impairment. Mrs Platt and Mrs Graham taught KA about each part of the ear and how their ears process sound. The class had a chance to put together parts of the ear, make their own paper ears and play with some dolls that have hearing aids and cochlea implants.







Music Tour is back from Tumut!

Last week, 60 of our children participated in the Music Tour (which takes place every 3 years for Years 4-6). It was an exciting 4-day musical journey that toured the Tumut region across 4 schools. The tour was accompanied by parents, school teachers and of course, ensemble conductors.

Our students performed at Franklin, Tumut and Gundagai Public Schools over Thursday and Friday. On Saturday, Tumut and Franklin PS's combined with Mowbray PS for a 4-hr workshop culminating in a combined performance of over 70 kids in the Concert Band including the Principal of Franklin PS who learnt sax on the day! Both country and city school children had an excellent opportunity to learn from each other and create musical memories. The children also had an opportunity to meet with Jodie Barton, ex-Mowbray Assistant Principal. It was an emotional time for all, Jodie had taught some of the year 5's and 6's as kindergarten children!

On Sunday, the tour began their journey back to Sydney, but not before stopping at Bungendore where they performed with the Bungendore Youth Orchestra. The Orchestra was led by ex-Mowbray Strings Conductor, Nicole Vieser. There were some very excited reunions on the day.

Thank you to everyone who made this happen from teachers, music committees, parents and our host schools to the wonderfully well-behaved children.



Be plastic free

Use a lunch box with a variety of sections or a few smaller containers.

Avoid plastic wrap, foil, zip lock bags, packaged foods.

Healthy plastic free tips


- Freeze healthy muffins and use each day.
- Cut your own cheese slices and place them with crackers in a small container.
