### **Voluntary Contributions**

In this newsletter I have attached the overview of the second round of spending for the P&C contributions so far in 2019.

I would like to **thank you** the community for your support through the payment of voluntary contributions and a *thank you* to our supportive P&C. Although contributions are voluntary, they allow us to provide extra resources and support for the learning of all children from Kindergarten to Year 6.

### **ICAS**

Thank you to those parents who responded to the ICAS survey request for your opinion last week. There were only 69 respondents in total, with 66% wanting the school to support ICAS. Although the survey was set to non-restrictive, I recognise that the platform was difficult for some users to access, and those access difficulties will be taken into consideration in future surveys, whenever possible.

Taking into account the whole school community, this a very low response in support of ICAS, however, the school will support ICAS for English and mathematics in 2019 as a trial to determine whether it is feasible in the coming years in the new online format. I appreciate all the parents who have volunteered their support, when we put together the organisation in September, we will look into roles and ways of support for these respondents. More information will be distributed closer to the date.

Waste free Monday went ahead this week (with a slight change to Waste Free Tuesday) with a little room for improvement. Congratulations to our token winning class **KS!**

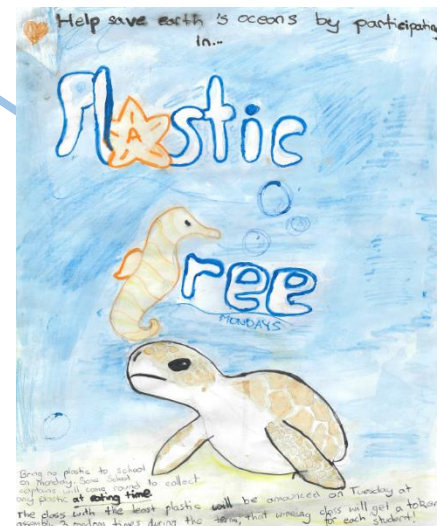
Don't forget we are making a big effort to save our environment through the reduction of waste! With special focus on a Monday.

**Contact Details** – When contacting the office regarding your child please include their name and class to allow us to deal with the matter promptly.

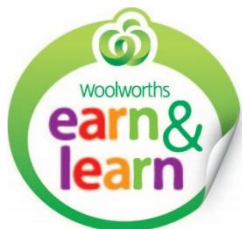
**Book Club** brochures will be sent home this week. Orders are due in by **Friday 14<sup>th</sup> June**.

In Term 2 Mowbray Public School has purchased some new teaching and learning equipment. Stage 2 received a class set of We Do Lego Education kits. Stage 3 has a class set of Mindstorm EV3 robotics kit.

The students have really enjoyed learning about, creating and then programming these Lego Robots. Engagement levels are high! The pictures tell a thousand words.



The benefits of this hands on approach to learning are many. Students have been introduced to block programming and their confidence levels in coding have really improved. Students learn STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) more effectively while improving and developing their 21st-century skills, including problem solving, collaboration, and communication.

The classes are really looking forward to more challenges in the future.

Term 1 total spend: \$36 440

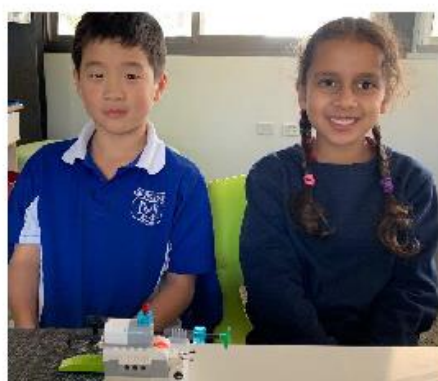
This term we have purchased LEGO EV3 Robotics set and a LEGO Education WeDO 2.0 set for the price of \$13 582.

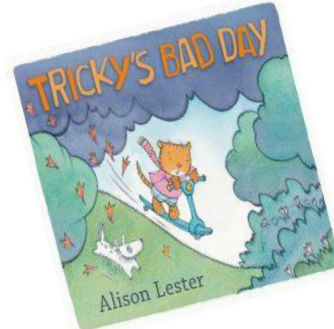

## Parking at Mowbray PS

**PARKING** around Mowbray is plentiful, but certain guidelines need to be followed to ensure pickups and drop-offs run smoothly for everyone – our kids are **ALL** important and **ALL** need our attention.

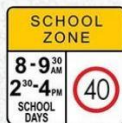


We have a school of over 620 children and we all need to be patient. Please **TAKE A MOMENT** to look through some reminders, for all families.

**KISS AND RIDE** zone on Mowbray Rd runs along the front of the school:



- Please move to the TOP of the zone to ensure the line moves smoothly and quickly
- Stop to drop off or pick up your child for a max of 2 minutes
- Driver must remain in or within 3 metres of vehicle.
- Council Rangers patrol this area



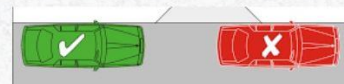
Please take note of the **SCHOOL ZONES** around the school (40km/h limit - in operation between from 8am-9:30am THEN 2:30pm-4pm).

**CUBBYHOUSE** carpark is for the use of Cubbyhouse families and staff. They have kindly let Mowbray use the space as a drop-off area – but the system only works if everyone follows the rules and guidelines. Please:



- Note the directional signage and adhere to it (stick to the LEFT)
- Do not park in the Cubbyhouse turning circle, it is a "NO STOPPING" Zone
- Do not park in the 3x "NO PARKING" areas
- Do not park in the Cubbyhouse Staff Parking
- Do not park in the Disabled Parking unless you hold a Permit
- Do not stop and drop-off in the middle of the car park
- If you plan to go into the Mowbray School grounds, you will need to park elsewhere.

Please do **NOT** park across any of our neighbours' driveways. Remember, everyone tries to park closely to the school - please park considerably, so spaces are maximised (eg don't leave excessively large gaps between cars)



There is a lot of **unrestricted parking** in Hart, Farran and Ulm Streets. Willandra Street and Mowbray Road parking is limited, but available. Please take note of the restricted parking in other areas. These areas may be patrolled.

### Standard Traffic Signs and Rules



**NO PARKING** - You have no more than 2 minutes for drop-offs or pick-ups of passengers or goods. The driver must stay within 3 metres of their vehicle



**NO STOPPING** - You must NOT stop your vehicle at any point on the road or kerb, unless there is a medical or other emergency



**DISABILITY** - For the use of vehicles displaying valid permits only. No Stopping for others

With your help, students can create a Student Profile Page which is unique to them. Linked to online fundraising, you can share their Profile Page and request donations from family and friends anywhere around the world. The average raised per student online is a massive \$120. # Got It!



Anxiety is a normal emotion, we all have it and it isn't always bad **but** if it is stopping your child from enjoying regular activities then it is time to do something before it gets worse.

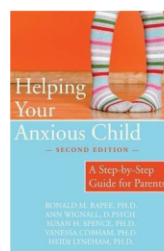
## Tips for dealing with child anxiety:

- Listen empathetically to what your child is worried about – this will support the feelings of worry to decrease as they have been shared.
- Be firm yet supportive of your child. Telling them to 'get over it' is not helpful but neither is allowing them to avoid the things they worry about – instead this can be an opportunity to problem solve.
- Help your child to think positively using affirmations.
- Teach your child self-soothing activities like slow breathing, slow stretching, or focusing on their five senses for when they feel worried.
