PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome Back!!

A big WELCOME BACK to all our MPS families. It is hard to believe we are already in Term 4!! At this time, we are finalising excursions and plans for the term. Information has gone home in stage newsletters.

Department of Education restrictions are allowing for a more 'normal' Term 4, but there are still compulsory COVID guidelines for all Department of Education schools that we must follow. As updates are given to the school they will be passed on to the community via School Stream and email.

The last day of term for students will be Wednesday 16 December.

Returning late or not returning in 2021?

Documentation of student movement is essential for the school executive to make 2021 classing structure decisions. Included in this newsletter is a form (that was also sent via School Stream) to inform the school if:

- your family will be taking extended leave over the December/January holidays and your child will be returning to school later than Friday 29 January 2021 (it is essential we have written documentation stating your proposed date of return) or
- your child in Kindergarten Year 5 will not be returning to MPS in 2021

I would politely request that families who fit into these categories please fill out the form included in this newsletter or complete the form electronically via School Stream.

Thank you for your support with our 2021 planning.

Change of start of year dates 2021

It was announced yesterday by the Department of Education that there will be <u>two</u> staff only development days to start the 2021 school year.

This will mean that the first day for students K-6 in 2021 will be <u>FRIDAY 29 January</u>. The last day of the 2021 school year will be Thursday 16 December.

2021 classing

At the end of every year, teachers and executive staff put <u>many</u> hours into forming classes for the next year. Teachers take into account how children work, who children work best with and friendship factors. As a school community we need to remember that children are in class for the best possible education, and classroom teachers have a deep understanding of class dynamics and how the students in their classes work best.

If you are concerned that your child has <u>significant special needs</u> that your 2020 classroom teacher is unaware of, or there are significant extenuating circumstances that need to be taken into account in 2021 classing, you can contact the office to make an appointment to meet with me or schedule a phone discussion. Appointments must be made <u>before</u> the 13 November.

Alternatively you can send an email to the school to explain your child's significant special needs. Emails should be sent to mowbray-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au with the subject line 'Attention Principal re: 2021 classing'.

Any requests made will be considered, but are **not** guaranteed. Any request sent through after the 13 November 2020 will not be able to be considered.

School entrances, student safety

The student entrances to the school are via *Mowbray Rd* or *Hatfield St*. It has been noticed that a few families are entering and exiting via the carpark on Willandra St. This is <u>not</u> a safe access point to the school as cars and delivery vans enter and exit this carpark at all times of the day.

Swim School change for 2020

Traditionally all our MPS students K-6 have participated in the Swim School Program. This program is a daily swim lesson for a week in Term 4. Due to the turbulence of 2020, we have had to make a change to the program for this year.

All students from K-2 will participate in the traditional Swim School program in Week 6 (16 November – 20 November inclusive).

All students in Year 3–6 will participate in the Surf Ed program, learning beach swimming and safety skills. Surf Ed will be a one day program on Wednesday 2 December.

Currently the plan is to return to the traditional Swim School program in 2021. Thank you for your understanding in regards to this change.

Selective High School Application for 2022 - Year 5 students

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply online using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online are available at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

An intention to apply note with detailed information was handed to all Year 5 students in Week 1 of Term 4. It has also been included in this newsletter. This note is not an application. Applications needs to be made online.

The application website opens at that link on 6 October 2020 and closes on 9 November 2020. You must apply before the closing date.

Last Reminder: Tell Them from Me

In 2021 we are embarking on a new school planning cycle. An essential part of preparing a new school plan is parent/carer voice.

As COVID is preventing on-site meetings and parent forums, to collect input from parents/carers, we are going to use the *Tell Them From Me* parent/carer survey as a starting point.

The survey data helps us:

- understand parents' perspectives on their children's experience at school, including teaching, communication and the school's support of learning and behaviour
- understand parents' perspectives on activities and practices at home related to their children's learning
- provide evidence of areas of strength to support self-assessment and reporting
- engage the school community in discussions to identify strategic directions for school improvement
- establish quantitative improvement measures and help schools track achievement against them.

Traditionally we have not had many parents/carers complete the parent survey.

It would be greatly appreciated if our parents/carers could take the time to fill in the survey at this link http://nsw.tellthemfromme.com/mps20 The survey is anonymous.

It is understood that we are in unprecedented times with significant COVID-19 restrictions, but we will be using this planning for the next 3 years, so please respond keeping your experiences of 'normal times' in mind too.



Dear Parents/carers,

Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2022

Dear Parent/Carer

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 11 March 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available in late September 2020 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

The application website opens at that link on 6 October 2020 and closes on 9 November 2020. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after 6 October 2020.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

The tear-off slip below is not an application and the school cannot apply on your behalf.



School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.


