When issues arise

Throughout the year parents might have questions or concerns about their child's academic progress/achievement or social issues. If you have concerns, this is our Mowbray PS process:

- 1. Speak to your child's teacher first:
 - Plan what you will say so you can clearly explain what the concern is. You might want to take some notes to help you.

- Have some ideas about how the concern could be resolved realistically. Working with your child's teacher can clarify the situation and identify ways your concerns can be addressed.
- If you need an interpreter, the school can arrange one please ask beforehand.
- Staying calm and clear about your concern helps you and school staff to discuss the situation and settle on an option or resolution that supports your child's education.
- 2. If you still have concerns after speaking to your child's teacher or if your concern is another aspect of school which is impacting your child, please speak to an Assistant Principal:

NAPLAN 2022

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. All NSW schools will sit NAPLAN online in 2022. Our school will be participating in NAPLAN between 10 and 20 May 2022.

In preparation for NAPLAN, our school will also be participating in practice tests between Tuesday 22 March and Friday 1 April. The practice test is a trial run and key preparation activity for NAPLAN in May. It is not an assessment of student ability, and the tests will not be marked. Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not recommended. Students can use the <u>public demonstration site</u> (https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site) to familiarise themselves with the types of questions and tools available in NAPLAN.

CHECK-IN ASSESSMENT FOR YEARS 4 AND 6

Year 4 and 6 students will participate in a reading and numeracy Check-in assessment.

The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 4 and 6 students during Term 1 Week 10

Students with disability may receive the same level of support during the assessment that they would normally receive in the classroom.

Well done to Matthew Balcombe for making it into Sydney North Regional Carnival next Wednesday. Good luck. – **Ms Bradshaw**













All students are encouraged to wear orange clothing or a traditional national costume on the day.



Tell Them From Me student survey:

Information for parents and consent form for parents and carers



Dear Parents and Carers

This term, our school is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed online and is run by an independent research company, **The Learning Bar** which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will **not** be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will be suppressed. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

As well as schools getting student feedback, the Department of Education, through the Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE), has access to data from across NSW and is running a research project to look at state-wide patterns of student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The research is looking at how these things impact on student outcomes, including academic performance. Individual students will not be identified in any CESE publications, and all information will be handled in accordance with the relevant privacy legislation. Students' personal information will **not** be disclosed by the department to any other person or body other than as required by law.

This research will help schools in New South Wales to better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will also help teachers and principals discuss what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped.

If you do not want your child to take part in the survey, please complete the attached form and return it to the school by Monday 14 March 2022.
