

Collecting your children during the day — If you need to collect your child during the school day, simply come to the Office; we will contact your child's classroom and issue a leaving slip. <u>Importance of road safety</u> – We have received some messages from concerned neighbours who have noticed children not using pedestrian crossings to cross the roads around Mowbray. As the school holidays approach, it is important to remind your children about the importance of road safety:

- hold your child's hand. Until they are at least 8 years old children need to hold an adult's hand. Until they at least 10, children should be closely supervised by an adult and hold hands when crossing the road.
- talk to your child about road safety. Talk about how to be safe when near roads. Be a good role model and always cross at a pedestrian crossing.

THE P&C NEEDS YOU


While we appreciate your financial support, the P&C really needs your time. We have several vacant roles both in the P&C Executive Committee and in the Strings and Band Sub-Committees.

The P&C Slime Spectacular fun run is next week! It's taking place on Friday 16th September from 2pm to 3:10pm.

Here we answer some FAQs.

Does my child need to fundraise to participate?

No, although we encourage everyone to get involved with fundraising, it is not a requirement of participating in the Slime Spectacular. You can set up a fundraising profile on <u>plantadifference.com.au</u>

Do I need to give permission for my child to participate?

Yes. A notice was sent on School Stream on Thursday 1st September. Please fill in this form if your child wishes to take part in the Slime Spectacular.

Can my child do the course without the slime?

Yes, we have designed the fun run to be like an obstacle course, so if your child doesn't want to be slimed, they can still take part in the course. Select 'no' on the permission note, but on the day, we will give all children the chance to run through the course if they want.

What should my child wear?

Although the slime will likely wash out of your child's clothes, we recommend they wear a plain white shirt.

What is the slime made out of?

The water-based slime is non-toxic and non-irritating for skin and eyes. <u>CLICK HERE</u> to view the slime safety data sheet. The volunteers will do their best to aim towards the torso however wind may mean cause the slime to protrude on your child's face or hair. Sunglasses will be provided on the day, but your child could also bring goggles if they prefer.

How will my child sit in the car/on the bus if they are covered in slime?

You can pack a towel to clean off any excess slime and to sit on OR bring a clean change of clothes OR bring a disposable poncho.

What are we raising money for?

We are hoping to raise \$50,000 as a school community to put towards four new interactive play spaces for the school. For every \$20 we raise, Carbon Neutral and the Great Barrier Reef Foundation will plant one coral in the Great Barrier Reef.

What prizes are available?

The class that raises the most money wins an early lunch break, party bags and they get to COLOUR BOMB Ms Alford! We also have Rebel Sport packs for the top 3 fundraisers!

The Plant a Difference fundraising platform has prizes too, including going into the draw to win a 5-night holiday to Hamilton Island on the Great Barrier Reef if you raise \$50 or more.
