PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

A big WELCOME BACK to all our students and families for Term 4.

Closure of Hatfield St Carpark

In wonderful news, the Department of Education has approved budget for the resurfacing of the Hatfield St carpark! This project will be done in stages and there will be some changes for our community to navigate as the carpark will need to be closed.

These are the proposed dates, but the project is weather dependent so they provide an approximation only.

Project starting 28 October 2024.

Stage 1 (28 October) - removal of surface and resurfacing. Carpark CLOSED.

Stage 2 (9 November) – surface needs time to cure, before lines are re-painted. Carpark will be **OPEN**, but there will be no line markings.

Although the carpark will be re-opened, parking could prove haphazard.

Stage 3 (early-mid December) – lines re-drawn and signage erected. Carpark will be **CLOSED** for 48 hours.

Although, there will be some short-term disruption, the end result will be a safe, resurfaced space.

Mowbray Public School Works notification | 23 October 2024

Dear staff, parents, carers, and neighbours,

We are upgrading the carpark at the rear of Mowbray Public School off Hatfield Street, opposite the oval and tennis courts.

The area will be fenced off to enable:

- replacement of all asphalt surfaces and a section of damaged gutter
- installation of wheel stops
- remarking parking spaces.

This work is scheduled to **begin on Monday 28 October** and will take approximately 2 weeks with the aim to be **completed by mid-November 2024**. The carpark and Hatfield Street vehicle entrance will be **closed** temporarily during this time. The staff and community will not have access to the carpark during this time.

• Scheduled works will take place during the times set out on weekdays - 7am to 6pm and Saturdays - 8am to 1pm.

There may be some construction noise from the machinery and trucks during these times.

Contractor vehicles, including trucks, will be accessing the carpark during this period which may impact traffic by adding some congestion surrounding the school and the entry point on Hatfield Road. Please allow extra time for student pick-ups and drop offs during this period.

Following the carpark upgrade, the painting of parking spaces on the new asphalt will take place in a separate period over 2 days in mid-December (exact dates yet to be confirmed). The carpark will be closed temporarily during this time to allow the paint to dry. We will provide further details about these dates once more information becomes available.

The health, safety, and wellbeing of the school and the local community is our highest priority. If you have any questions about this work, please contact the NSW Department of Education on the details below.



School Student Travel



School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Applications are now open for 2025 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their School Opal card at their nominated postal address from mid-January 2025.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use. This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times. All students are required to comply with the Student code of conduct. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.







Become a Foster Carer in Chatswood

The NSW Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ) is urgently seeking potential foster carers in the Chatswood area. We need people who can provide care for children, young people, or siblings, aged 0-18 years-old, for a few days, to a few months and beyond.

Foster carers support families by caring for children who are unable to remain at home. Foster carers come from all walks of life and their families reflect the wider community we live in. Carers can be single, partnered and be with or without children of their own. Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islanders and people from culturally diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.

Foster carers receive initial and ongoing training and support from a dedicated foster care caseworker. There are financial support packages available to foster carers to support a child's education, medical needs, food costs and other daily living costs.
