At the end of every year, teachers and executive staff put <u>many</u> hours into forming classes for the next year. As a school community we need to remember that children are in class for the best possible education, and classroom teachers have a deep understanding of class dynamics and how the students in their classes work best.

If you are concerned that your child has <u>significant special needs</u> that your 2024 classroom teacher is unaware of, or there are significant extenuating circumstances that need to be taken into account in 2025 classing, you can contact me via email or phone <u>by</u> Friday 22 November.

Emails should be sent to <u>mowbray-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u> with the subject line 'Attention Principal re: 2025 classing' explaining your child's significant needs or extenuating circumstances. All emails will be treated confidentially.

Any requests made will be considered, but are **not** guaranteed. Any request sent through after Friday 22 November 2024 will not be able to be considered.

Requests should not be sent to classroom teachers.

Reminder: Returning late or not returning in 2025?

Documentation of student movement is essential for the school executive to make 2025 classing structure decisions.

There is a form to fill in (located on the SchoolBytes dashboard and in the top menu 'Forms' Section) to inform the school if:

• your family will be taking extended leave over the December/January holidays and your child will be returning to school later than <u>Thursday 6 February 2025</u> (it is essential we have documentation stating your proposed date of return) or;

• your child in Kindergarten – Year 5 will not be returning to MPS in 2025


Mini Fete and Sausage Sizzle – Friday 29 November Buy your tokens now!!


Tokens: Students will be able to purchase sheets of tokens prior to the mini fete. Stall activities cost between 50c and \$2.00, depending on the activity. Tokens can be purchased in multiples of \$5.00. (A \$5.00 sheet will allow students to participate in approx. 4-6 activities.) The token sheets will be distributed to the students on the day of the mini fete by their class teacher.

No cash will be collected on the day of the fete. All tokens must be pre-purchased on School Bytes. Any unspent tokens will not be reimbursed.

Sausage Sizzle: - Year 6 will be running a sausage sizzle for lunch. Students can purchase a sausage sizzle and juice popper pack these must be preordered via School Bytes. **Orders close Monday 25 November**. Cost of a sausage sizzle and popper pack is \$6.00.

Log in to your School Bytes Parent Portal or App and follow these steps:

- · Go to the Payments tab
- · Click on "Add other item"
- · Select the student you are purchasing for

For Mini Fete Tokens:

Nominate a dollar amount (minimum \$5, no more than \$20)

For Sausage Sizzle orders:

Select the beef or vegetarian sausage option. If you would like to purchase more than one sausage, click on "add items". If you have more than one child you will need to repeat these steps for each one, making sure you select each student.

The students must be commended for their infectious enthusiasm and inclusivity during group activities.


NSW Premier's Reading Challenge

We are so proud of all those involved, and congratulate all participating students who persevered through the sun and heat and gave it their best!



Getting to school by bus in 2025

Will your child be catching the bus to school next year? Applications are now open for a 2025 School Opal cards. As it's a busy time of year, we highly recommend you make this application before the end of this year. It's also good to check the bus timetable to make your child's journey to school as easy as possible. Here is how it works:

School Opal cards

- All students catching the bus in 2025 will need a School Opal card.
- Under the <u>School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS</u>), eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.
- For more information about the SSTS and how to apply for a School Opal Card, visit https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/ from a desktop computer, and click 'apply for a school travel pass'.

Bus timetables

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1. Go to busways.com.au/nsw
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device. If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.
- 5. Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.
